2020 was a difficult year! Nonetheless, CAA reached a record for life saving efforts. Our overall Save Rate for the 4th quarter was 89% and for 2020 was 86%. Both achievements are the highest ever attained by the organization since we began operations in 2010 with the goal of saving the lives of lost and abandoned animals in East Baton Rouge Parish.

2020 results are largely affected by Covid and by cats. CAA and Animal Control were closed except for emergencies during the community shut-down. Since then, in order to protect the health of our staff and the public, we have had an appointments-only policy for most services. Also, we are newly recognizing the intake and outcome of all TNR cats.

Intake for dogs was down significantly in all categories. Intake for cats was also down except for TNR. Rescue organizations took more dogs and cats in 2020 than 2019 and the newly impounded TNR releases added almost 800 positive outcomes. With less housing pressure, there was a dramatic decrease in euthanasias: 389 fewer or -36% for dogs and 250 fewer or -61% for cats. The end result was a new record Save Rate for dogs of 79% and 92% for cats in 2020 vs. 73% and 80% respectively in 2019.

As always, it truly takes a village. We could not do this work successfully without the strong leadership of our management team and caring staff, our partners in transport and rescue, without the many foster families and individuals who take CAA pets into their homes, the volunteers who provide much needed pet socialization at the shelter and relieve the burden on our limited staff, nor without the many donors who give supplies and financial support to the cause.
