LETTER *from the* CHAIR

It is hard to put into words a year such as 2020. Like the rest of the world, our shelter came face-to-face with the effects of Covid-19: adoptions came to a halt, our volunteer room emptied, the dog park was eerily quiet, and all major events were cancelled. As hospital heroes compassionately cared for people, CAA's shelter team pushed on as a refuge for Baton Rouge's abandoned animals.

Despite the shutdown, CAA – the only municipal open-intake shelter in East Baton Rouge Parish – continued to offer essential services, providing care for those animals unable to go into foster homes and for emergency drop offs. Countless protocols and programs rapidly shifted to better serve the community and their pets. For example, we launched a pet food pantry inside the shelter to assist those impacted by Covid's

social side effects including layoffs, evictions, and illness. With a grant from the Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Louisiana Foundation, we also introduced Get Fit with a Fido, a socially distanced dog-walking program that gave volunteers a healthy, COVID-safe way to help shelter pets.

As if the pandemic weren't challenging enough, Louisiana experienced major hurricanes, decimating cities and leaving families and pets displaced. CAA was proud to partner with the Louisiana State Animal Response Team and the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry to distribute pet food, supplies, and veterinary care to Hurricane Laura victims in August. It was a privilege for our shelter to step up and help fellow Louisianans and their pets, as so many had done for us during the historic 2016 floods.

Despite such unimaginable occurrences, the extraordinary pet-loving community of Baton Rouge never missed a beat. With assistance from our foster network, volunteers, rescue groups, community cat partners and transport allies, our save rate reached a record high of 86% in 2020.

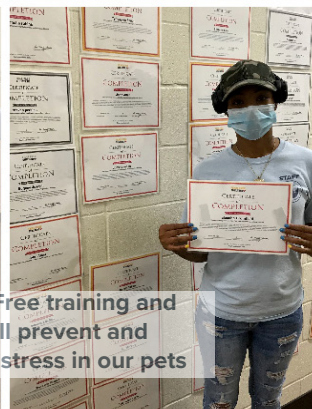
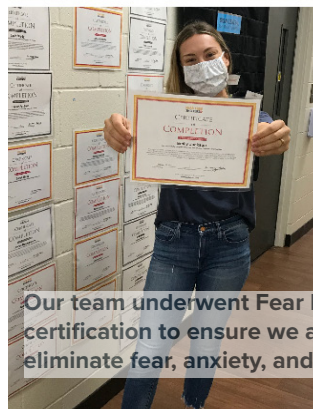
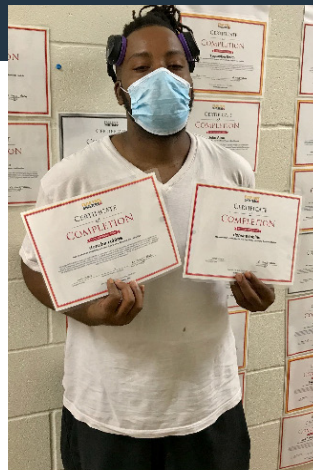

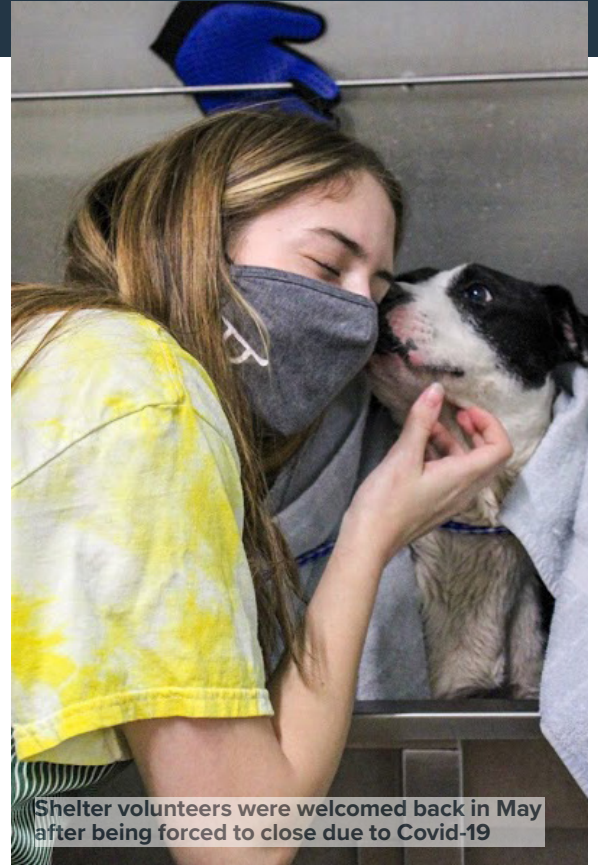

The year 2020 will be a dark spot in the minds of many. But for CAA, this year that challenged all represents second chances, saved lives, and hope.

In 2020, we reached a record-high in our life saving efforts with a save rate for the 4th quarter of 89% and an overall rate of 86% for the year. Both achievements are the highest ever attained by the organization since we began operations in 2010 with the goal of saving the lives of pets in East Baton Rouge Parish.

In March - within 24 hours of the Governor's stay at home order - nearly 130 shelter pets moved into temporary homes. Hundreds more joined them throughout quarantine. Working to get the pets adopted or into foster care was a massive effort by staff working around the clock, volunteers taking on unglamorous roles, and vet care expediting surgeries and exams. But the true heroes were our fosters. Dedicated, veteran fosters quickly stepped into the role as mentors to the new and apprehensive. Dozens waited in line outside the shelter for hours just to take a pet or two home even while unsure how their own families or lives would be impacted by the virus.

Getting pets out before we were forced to close our doors was crucial, especially as we prepared to remain open to accept incoming pets in medical or other emergency situations. Our veterinary team provided TLC

and care, and ensured we had enough kennel space for those that posed a safety risk to the public. All this made possible thanks to our fosters.

That sunny March day gave us hope; we witnessed firsthand the power of community, and working together, when it comes to saving more lives. Our network of supporters stepped up in a way we had never seen before, proving that even in times of trauma and chaos, they would be innovative, creative, and dedicated to CAA's mission.

As always, it truly takes a village. We could not have reached this record save rate without our dedicated team of our fosters, volunteers, donors, community cat partners, transporters, and rescue organizations. We thank you, one and all.



THREE-LEGGED RACE TO THE NORTH

Did you know that CAA has rescue partners in the northeast which gladly take our pets and find them homes? Because of weather, spay/neuter regulations and breeding laws, this region lacks available companion animals and rarely struggles with pet overpopulation. These partners have waiting lists of eager pet adopters. Through tightly organized transports governed by our protocols and partner protocols, some of our adoptable pets are guaranteed an immediate foster home and a much higher chance of a speedy adoption.

Dobby, a two-year-old Hound mix, was one of these lucky transport pups in 2020. He was saved by a good Samaritan after being hit by a car, suffering traumatic injuries. Dobby was brought to LSU's Vet School then transferred to CAA four days later to resume his medical care, including an amputation of his fractured front leg.

CAA's vet care team was proud to watch Dobby's full recovery. His outgoing personality demanded everyone's attention, "talking" all day in the clinic and providing the team with nonstop hound music. He was the office lunch thief and provided endless laughter. Although he would be greatly missed here in Baton Rouge, Dobby made his journey to Maine on a cold November day to meet his potential adopters.

Today? His new family takes him on long walks in the woods, allowing him to leisurely sniff and explore the great outdoors. Dobby's family is even in search of a physical therapist offering acupuncture to ensure he has the best quality of life as a three-legged pup. Dobby's second chance was made possible by so many, from the good Samaritan who brought him to CAA, to the vet care team, to the foster that offered her home prior to the transport, to our rescue partner in Maine, and of course to Dobby's adoptive family.

We rely on transport fosters to give our traveling pups like Dobby a comfortable place to stay for two weeks, learning behavioral tendencies and preferences so the receiving rescue can select the best suited adoptive family. To get started as a transport foster please email foster@caabr.org.



GET FIT WITH FIDO



The fears and cautions surrounding the Covid-19 virus kept most CAA volunteers at bay in the early months of 2020. It was a brand-new challenge for our team to find ways for them to continue helping around the shelter while following CDC guidelines and maintaining healthy conditions. With this in mind, CAA launched Get Fit with Fido, a socially distanced dog-walking program giving volunteers an opportunity to help shelter pets in the middle of the pandemic. This exercise program was made possible thanks to a grant from the Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Louisiana Foundation and created the perfect opportunity to safely welcome back our volunteers.

Participating in Get Fit with Fido was a win-win for pets and people. Humans got exercise and much needed fresh air. Pets got the same plus socialization, enrichment, and leash training – making it more likely that they would be adopted sooner. To encourage getting fit and staying motivated, participants were provided a pedometer to track the steps walked with each shelter pup, plus a leash and collar, reusable water bottle, face mask, program t-shirt and tote bag. We thank Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Louisiana Foundation for this fun and valuable program.

PETS FOR LIFE EASES THE COVID BURDEN



The Covid pandemic forced countless Americans to grapple with the possibility of losing their homes because they could not afford rent. These dire times were, and continue to be, even more heartbreaking for those who have family pets and are faced with the impossible choice of keeping their animals or finding affordable housing.

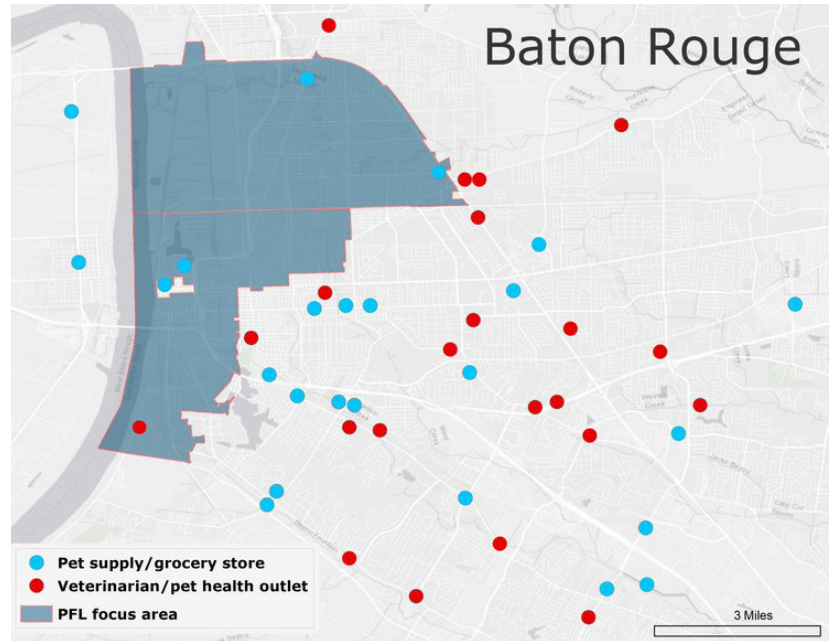
Baton Rougeans were no bystanders to these harsh realities. Area resident, Ms. Darlene, became unemployed in September due to the Covid pandemic. Unemployment eventually led to eviction from her home where she resided with her grandson, two dogs, five cats, two ducks, two chickens, and a parakeet. She and her grandson stayed with a family member leaving the 10 pets alone in the vacant house. While searching for a new place, Darlene visited her pets daily to care for them, hoping they wouldn't be separated for long.

In normal times, CAA's Pets for Life BR (PFLBR) helps underserved families with food, care, and pet education. More pets stay with the families that love them and avoid coming to the shelter. 2020 was not normal.

When PFLBR learned about Darlene's situation, the team stepped in to provide food and veterinary care for all of Darlene's pets. With this assistance, she was able to pay a pet deposit and settle into a new home with her entire crew. While Darlene's crew was especially large, PFL helped families of all sizes rise to the many pandemic challenges.

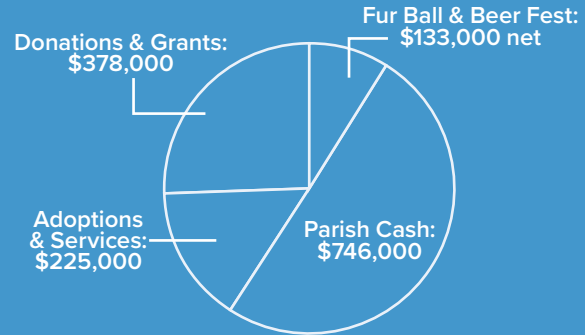

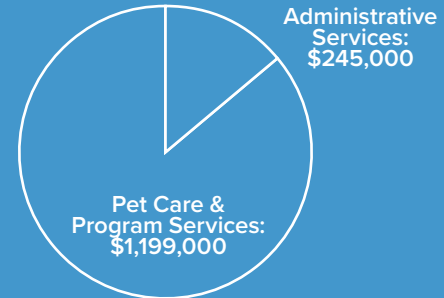
